What to Look For

In this Reading Log you will keep track of what you have read and learned. You will look for a few specific things every week. You will want to pace yourself and complete three Stop and Notices every week--if you put it off, it will become overwhelming. We will also do some online discussions, so pay attention to announcements on Google Classroom.

The two main things you will be recording in the packet are:

- 1. Stop and Notice
- 2. So What?

Each of these categories will help you approach your book in a different way and learn from what you read. Below you will find a description of each category.

1. Stop and Notice

In this section, you will write down things **you** notice while you are reading and questions that you may have. This is a place for you to start thinking and discovering.

As you stop and notice, watch for a few things in particular:

a. Tough Questions

Tough Questions are when the character has to make a difficult decision or face a hard truth. Tough Questions can also be questions that the character is asked that are hard to answer. Tough questions make characters grow and can let us know what might happen in the story.

b. Contrasts and Contradictions

Contrasts and Contradictions occur when a character does or says something unexpected or different from what they have been saying or doing in the book so far. When this happens, ask yourself, "Why is the character doing that?"

c. Words of the Wiser

Words of the Wiser are the little tidbits of wisdom that usually come from ... well, an older and wiser character. Words of the wiser help characters realize a truth that they have been missing.

d. Aha Moments

Have you ever been reading and suddenly figured something out? The truth of it hits you like a ton of bricks, or you get excited about the discovery. That is your Aha Moment. Aha Moments can also be when *characters* figure something out.

2. So What?

In the So What? Section you will have a chance to think about your experience with the book as a whole--as well as demonstrate your ability to read closely.
